Regularly featured on National Public Radio's "Performance Today," the Flagler Museum Music Series brings the best chamber groups from around the world to the finest chamber music venue in South Florida. Experience chamber music, as it was intended, in a gracious and intimate setting. Audience members are invited to a champagne and dessert reception with the musicians following each concert.

Described as "a miracle of unified thought..." (La Presse, Montreal) and "nothing short of a revelation" (Calgary Herald) the Calidore String Quartet has established itself an international reputation for its informed, polished and captivating performances. The Calidore has debuted in such prestigious festivals as Verbier and Ravinia and the Schneider Concert Series (NYC) and is a featured "Young Artist-in-Residence" on American Public Media's "Performance Today".

Formed at the Colburn Conservatory of Music in Los Angeles in 2010, the Calidore String Quartet quickly won grand prize in virtually all American chamber music competitions including the Fischhoff, Coleman, Chesapeake, and Yellow Springs competitions. Internationally they captured top prizes at the 2012 ARD Munich International String Quartet Competition and the 2012 Hamburg International Chamber Music Competition.

When it was completed in 1902, Whitehall, Henry Flagler’s Gilded Age estate in Palm Beach, was hailed by the New York Herald as “more wonderful than any palace in Europe, grander and more magnificent than any other private dwelling in the world.” Today, Whitehall is a National Historic Landmark and is open to the public as the Flagler Museum, featuring guided tours, changing exhibits, and special programs. The Museum is located at Cocoanut Row and Whitehall Way, Palm Beach. The Museum is open from 10:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m., Tuesday through Saturday, and noon until 5:00 p.m. Sunday. Admission is \$18 for adults, \$10 for youth ages 13-17, \$3 for children ages 6-12, and children under six are free.
