Flagler Museum Announces Whitehall Lecture Series Heroes of the Homefront: World War I and the Faces of Wartime America

Palm Beach, FL - The 33rd Annual Whitehall Lecture Series, *Heroes of the Homefront: World War I and the Faces of Wartime America*, will commemorate the roles of American soldiers and supporters during World War I.
