Award-winning Joe Mullins & The Radio Ramblers join lineup at 15th Annual Bluegrass in the Pavilion at the Flagler Museum

PALM BEACH, FL - The <u>Henry Morrison Flagler Museum</u>, celebrating its 60th Anniversary, has added multi-award-winning Joe Mullins & The Radio Ramblers to the lineup at its 15th annual <u>Bluegrass in the Pavilion</u> concert, scheduled for April 18, 2020 at 3 p.m inside the Flagler Kenan Pavilion. The five-man band will be opening for duo Dailey & Vincent, who were previously announced as the headliner. Proceeds from the concert's ticket sales benefit the Flagler Museum's education programs for children.



Led by Bluegrass veteran Joe Mullins on the banjo, the band includes Florida native Jason Barie on fiddle, Mike Terry on mandolin and vocals, Adam McIntosh on guitar and vocals, and Randy Barnes on upright bass and vocals. The band is a proven industry and fan favorite, having garnered six International Bluegrass Music Association (IBMA) and four SPBGMA Awards, including the 2018 IBMA Award for "Song of the Year" for "If I'd Have Wrote That Song." They debuted at the historic Grand Ole Opry in 2013 and have made regular guest appearances since. The band also boasts 11 number one songs and albums since 2013, with four albums on Billboard's Top Selling Albums Chart. Band leader Mullins is also host of Front Porch Fellowship, a syndicated radio show that broadcasts weekly on

over 200 radio stations. The band previously performed at the Flagler Museum's bluegrass show in 2012.

"Joe Mullins is a classic character who could slip through a time machine to about 1961 and move around comfortably. And he'd be among the coolest cats there in his Ohio home, fronting a bluegrass band and owning radio stations. And that voice! Whether speaking or singing, it's arresting and comforting at the same time. This is the true sound of bluegrass renown.
