# Flagler Museum Announces 2021/2022 Season of Programming

PALM BEACH, FL - The <u>Henry Morrison Flagler Museum</u> (1 Whitehall Way, Palm Beach), has announced programming for the upcoming 2021/2022 Season.

New this Season is a program inspired by the 2019 return of Whitehall's original Dining Room furniture suite. The communityfocused *Together, at the Table* series will be centered around dining practices, cultural foodways, and culinary traditions relevant to Florida history. The series at its essence is a celebration of the rich diversity of South Florida's expansive cultural heritage and an intentional spotlight on the people of our community. A fresh crop of programming will be announced all Season long, starting with a farm-to-table dinner event in November.

While the Flagler Museum will not be hosting special exhibitions in Whitehall's second floor gallery this Season, it does plan to announce a number of additional programs in the coming months including the Whitehall Lecture Series and other special lectures, Museum Store events, and collaborations with other non-profits and community-serving organizations. Due to the uncertainty of the ongoing pandemic, all programming is subject to change or cancelation. Visitors are encouraged to check the Museum's website for the most up-to-date information and to review the Museum's public safety protocols.

Below, please find descriptions of previously unannounced planned programming, listed in chronological order:

Tomb of the Unknown Soldier: A Century of Honor, 1921-2021 Lecture presented by Philip Bigler November 11, 2021 at 2:00 pm \$20 for Veterans and Members at the Family and Individual/Educator levels \$38 for Non-members, includes general admission Free for Sustaining level Members and higher Free for Whitehall Society Members Space is limited, reservations are required

On November 11, 1921, the United States buried an Unknown Soldier on the plaza of the Memorial Amphitheater at Arlington National Cemetery. For 100 years, the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier has served as the nation's most sacred and recognized military shrine—a

place of national pilgrimage and somber reflection. Over the ensuing years, this magnificent monument has been enhanced and expanded with the addition of unknowns from World War II and Korea (1958) as well as a Vietnam Unknown (1984). At the site, a perpetual military guard is rigorously maintained regardless of weather conditions, terrorist attack, or even a global pandemic.

In commemoration of Veteran's Day, the Flagler Museum is offering free general admission to U.S. Military Veterans on November 11, 2021 during regular hours. Veterans who wish to attend the lecture will enjoy a discounted ticket price of \$20.

## Swank Farm presents Florida's Fall Harvest at the Flagler Museum November 18, 2021 at 6:00 pm \$190 per person, \$350 per couple Reservations are required

Kicking off the Museum's new *Together, at the Table* series is a collaboration with Swank Farm for a Florida harvest-themed culinary experience in the Cocoanut Grove, prepared by globally-renowned chef Pushkar Marathe. This 5-course food and wine adventure will integrate fresh, local ingredients that spotlight the diversity of South Florida's cultural heritage and celebrate the best of Florida agriculture — a mainstay of Florida's economy fortified by Henry Flagler's Model Land Company and his Florida East Coast Railway at the turn of the 20th century.

Swank Farm is a 20-acre hydroponic and sustainable farm situated in Loxahatchee Groves, growing over 350 varieties of food and flowers. Run by Darren and Jodi Swank, the family farm offers our community fresh produce and specialty goods through more than 25 vendors at their seasonal Farm Market, and supplies specialty produce to restaurants and chefs throughout Dade, Broward and Palm Beach Counties. Currently entering its 21st growing season and 12th year offering farm-to-table dinners under an impressive, open-air pole barn, Swank Farm grows with the use of no chemicals and offers a Swank Farm CSA program.

Chef Pushkar Marathe is the owner of Stage Kitchen in Palm Beach Gardens. Born in Nagpur, India, Pushkar's culinary roots originate in his homeland, cooking with his parents in the family's kitchen. At age 20, he began his culinary training in Switzerland and then embarked on a decades-long exploration of international cuisine. He has held cooking positions in the Caribbean, Cayman Islands, across the U.S., and the Middle East. He's worked in mentor Dean Max's restaurants and most recently in partnership with Niven Patel at Ghee Indian Restaurant. The chef, a resident of Jupiter, sources his inspiration from seasonal and regional cuisine.

## The Henry Morrison Flagler Museum

When it was completed in 1902, Whitehall, Henry Flagler's Gilded Age estate in Palm Beach, was hailed by the New York Herald as "more wonderful than any palace in Europe, grander and more magnificent than any other private dwelling in the world." Today, Whitehall is a National Historic Landmark and is open to the public as the Flagler Museum, featuring changing exhibitions and special programs. The Museum is located at One Whitehall Way, Palm Beach, FL 33480. Hours are Tuesday to Saturday, 10 am to 5 pm, and Sunday, 12 to 5 pm.
