Fall Exhibition:

The Story of Whitehall: 120 Years in the Making

October 18 – December 31, 2022 Included with Museum admission

In honor of the 120th Anniversary of the completion of Whitehall, the Flagler Museum presents the 2022 Fall Exhibition, "*The Story of Whitehall: 120 Years in the Making.*"

Having completed the world's largest wooden structure, the Hotel Royal Poinciana, on the eastern shore of Lake Worth, and laid out and named the streets for what he hoped would become a thriving metropolis on the western shore, Henry Flagler began to think about building a home near the Hotel where he would live out his remaining years.

Unlike the other houses Flagler owned or had built, this house would, as Andrew Carnegie advised in his essay, the *Gospel of Wealth*, be a home "for all that is highest and best in literature and arts, and for all the refinements of civilization." In other words, a home for Apollo's Muses of arts and literature, a museum.

Carrère and Hastings' design for Whitehall is filled with symbolism related to Western Culture that any reasonably well-educated person, as Henry Flagler certainly was, of the 1840s would have immediately understood. As one of the 40% of young men in 1840s who was lucky enough to get an eighth-grade education, Henry Flagler would have been well educated in the traditions and mythology of Western Culture and very much aware of the rich meaning designed into Whitehall by the architects. Unfortunately, because our educational process has taken on a different focus over the last 180 years, much of that meaning is invisible to visitors today. However, with a little help we can see Whitehall through Flagler's eyes and begin to understand how much more it meant to him than simply the large and beautiful home that most see it as today.

Carrère and Hastings' design for Whitehall, featured in *American Architecture* in May of 1900, was an unusual blend of Beaux-Art design and details that seemed more appropriate to its subtropical location. The design of Whitehall's façade and Grand Hall is clearly a reference to a temple to Apollo, the Sun God and leader of the Muses.

Christmas Tree Lighting 12:00 - 5:00 pm, Sunday, December 4, 2022 Free with Museum admission

The 16-foot tall Grand Hall Christmas Tree, with its historically accurate trimmings, is the center of Whitehall's holiday celebrations. The Tree Lighting festivities include holiday music played on Whitehall's original 1,249-pipe Odell organ and the 1902 Steinway art-case grand piano. This annual performance is the only opportunity visitors have to hear both of Whitehall's majestic instruments. Special choir performances, refreshments and a visit from Santa Claus complete the afternoon's activities. The event culminates with Henry Flagler's youngest descendants lighting the Grand Hall Christmas Tree. Each visitor will receive a box of Animal Crackers, a treat invented in the Gilded Age. The iconic circus box was originally designed as a Christmas Tree ornament.

The American West During the Gilded Age
January 24 - April 23, 2023

The Flagler Museum's 2023 winter exhibition *The American West During the Gilded Age* will introduce and consider those aspects of the American West during the Gilded Age that were important to both the development of the nation and the shaping of the American character, including: the role of railroads in opening up the West, Native Americans of the West, the impact of the Homestead Act, Mountain Men and the importance of the fur trade, the role of the US Army in the West, the development of cattle ranching, the importance of mining in the West, the West as entertainment, the development of the National Park System, the growth of the nation as 11 states and massive amounts of land were added to the Union, and the Lawmen and Outlaws of the West.

So much of how the Gilded Age is viewed and understood has been shaped by what has been written about the activities and experiences of those living in cities, particularly those cities in the Northeast. However, there were an entirely different set of experiences and activities taking place during the Gilded Age that were as big as the West itself and every bit as important to both the development of the nation and the shaping the American character.

The Annual Bluegrass in the Pavilion concert will see the return of the Larry Stephenson Band and Joe Mullins & The Radio Ramblers. The award-winning Larry Stephenson Band has been entertaining audiences for 30 years including their numerous performances on the Grand Ole Opry, RFD-TV and headlining festivals and concerts all across the US and Canada. The group is led by Virginia Country Music Hall of Fame member and 5-time Society for The Preservation of Bluegrass Music in America (SPBGMA) Male Vocalist of the year. When it was completed in 1902, Whitehall, Henry Flagler's Gilded Age estate in Palm Beach, was hailed by the New York Herald as "more wonderful than any palace in Europe, grander and more magnificent than any other private dwelling in the world." Today, Whitehall is a National Historic Landmark and is open to the public as the Flagler Museum, featuring guided tours, changing exhibits, and special programs. The Museum is located at Cocoanut Row and Whitehall Way, Palm Beach.

The Museum is open from 10:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m., Tuesday through Saturday, and noon until 5:00 p.m. on Sunday. Admission is \$26 for adults, \$18 for youth ages 13-17, \$3 for children ages 6-12, and children under six are free.
